Bright Insight Support Network, inclusive of the Bloomers Gifted & 2e Adult Community, seeks to build and maintain, and is actively working toward, a culture where knowledge is created through the integration of lived experience, research, interdisciplinary insight, and observable outcomes. Individuals are recognized as the primary interpreters of their own internal experiences, while shared learning is strengthened through dialogue, evidence, and collaborative meaning-making.

We seek to cultivate and continuously strengthen a culture where integrity, accuracy, and ethical consistency are prioritized over social status, credentials alone, or performative authority.

We seek to support and expand human development through curiosity, critical thinking, reflection, and precise communication.

We ongoingly work to facilitate learning environments that do not rely on authority or social performance as substitutes for clarity, evidence, or ethical behavior. Participation in our programs, communities, and learning spaces is designed to be informed and voluntary. Access to support, learning, and community participation is not intended to be dependent on coercion, pressure, manipulation, or undue influence. Financial sustainability is structured to support long-term access and mission continuity, ensuring that sustainability and accessibility function together rather than in opposition.

We seek to recognize and continually learn from the reality that human development and identity are complex, dynamic, and context-influenced, shaped by biological, psychological, social, cultural, and environmental factors.

We seek to avoid treating difference as pathology, and we work to avoid reducing individuals to diagnoses, labels, or single identity characteristics.

We expect and respect variation in communication, cognition, emotional processing, identity expression, and developmental pathways.

We are working together to examine how power operates within relationships, organizations, knowledge systems, and communities.

We seek to make power visible, understandable, and intentionally directed toward dignity, autonomy, safety, and information integrity. Influence within our ecosystem is intended to develop through transparent processes, demonstrated integrity, meaningful contribution, and alignment with shared organizational values.

We affirm human diversity across neurological, cultural, racial, ethnic, gender, sexual orientation, socioeconomic, and geographic experiences. This includes explicit support for neurodivergent people, LGBTQ+ communities, Black, Indigenous, and People of Color (BIPOC), and individuals whose identities or lived experiences have historically been underrepresented or excluded.

We seek to support good-faith dialogue, critical discussion, and respectful disagreement.

We do not support harassment, coercion, or exploitation.

Harassment is defined as repeated or targeted behavior toward a person that includes insults, threats, demeaning language, or attempts to intimidate, especially after a boundary has been set.

Coercion includes pressuring someone to adopt beliefs, disclose personal information, or engage in interactions against their will.

Exploitation includes taking advantage of vulnerability for personal, social, or financial gain.

We hold space for disagreement, including direct, critical, or intense discussion. Disagreement alone is not harassment.

Content will be moderated when there is a clear pattern of harmful behavior, rather than based on discomfort, differing beliefs, or single interactions.

We do not support misinformation or behavior that undermines psychological safety, autonomy, or information integrity.

Our goal is to balance open dialogue with visible boundaries that prevent harm.

Maintaining this culture is a shared responsibility, and we understand ourselves to be collective stewards of the space across leadership, participants, collaborators, and community members. Culture is actively maintained through reflection, feedback, repair when harm occurs, values-aligned stewardship, and continued alignment with stated values and ethical commitments, recognizing that culture is both actively practiced and continuously evolving, and that we are continually working toward deeper alignment with these commitments.
